GBC's Business Outlook Conference 2008 draws 400-plus members to hear energy industry panel

A panel of energy industry experts told the audience at the **Greater Baltimore Committee's** Business Outlook Conference 2008 on Oct. 29 that the electric power industry's future over the next three decades will be characterized by increasing demand, new generating plant construction, stronger environmental regulations and a growing customer motivation to conserve.

About 400 GBC members and guests attended the breakfast meeting at the Renaissance Harborplace Hotel. Panel members were William Brier, vice president of public policy for the Edison Institute; William L. Massey, a partner at Covington and Burling and a former member of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission; and Malcolm D. Woolf, director of the Maryland Energy Administration.

"Our industry is entering most significant building phase in its history," Brierly said.
